Frog Docent Training: **Sky Oaks & Little Carson Falls**

The required training begins at Sky Oaks Headquarters followed by a 3-mile, round-trip, strenuous hike to Little Carson Falls. Minimum commitment is three 5-hour shifts between March and June.
