# EARLY STAGES OF DROUGHT: IT'S TIME TO CONSERVE

We have entered into the early stages of drought, and we are asking all of our customers to conserve water. Only 20 inches of rain fell at Lake Lagunitas during all of 2020; that's less than half of the average. In fact, 2020 was the second-driest year in 90 years.

As of mid-February, our reservoirs were at 57 percent storage capacity, compared with the historical average for this time of 86 percent.

In response to our low water supply, Marin Water's board of directors has adopted a resolution declaring Initial Drought Water Conservation Actions. We are asking all customers to voluntarily reduce their water usage. You can help conserve our limited water supply by making some simple changes.



Turn off your irrigation system. If necessary, water only by hand, no more than three times a week.



Consider replacing your lawn with low water use plants.



Only run your dishwasher or washing machine when you have a full load.

Other ways to save water include: turning off the water when brushing your teeth, taking shorter showers, and fixing any leaky toilets or faucets promptly. We also offer rebates to help with the cost of installing highefficiency washing machines, replacing your lawn, and switching to smart irrigation controllers that automatically adjust based on weather conditions.

Marin Water is making changes to our daily operations to ensure we are delivering water to your tap as efficiently as possible. For example, we have suspended our annual water main flushing program. We are assigning additional work crews to find and repair leaks faster than ever. We also increased the amount of water we purchase from Sonoma Water to help supplement our supply.








## Reservoir Storage
