

We are in a severe drought.

This is a historic drought. In the past 16 months, we have recorded the lowest rainfall levels in more than 140 years. Our goal is a 40% reduction in overall water use districtwide. It is essential that we all save as much water as possible now. Visit MarinWater.org/Conserve to see how you can save water.

There are water use restrictions.

- Spray irrigation limited to two days.
- Drip irrigation limited to three days.
- Do not wash vehicles at home.
- No washing driveways or sidewalks.
- No refilling or topping off fountains.
- No power washing homes or businesses.
- Do not water between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- Covers are required for pools and spas.
- Do not waste water.
- Fix leaks within 48 hours after finding them.

More ways to save water.

Outdoors

- Replace lawns with water-efficient landscaping.
- Water by hand, only if necessary.
- Use mulch to prevent evaporation.
- Install a graywater system that reuses water for irrigation.
- Use "smart" irrigation controllers that adjust based on weather.

Indoors

- Take 5-minute showers.
- Do laundry and dishes only when you have full loads.
- Turn the water off while brushing your teeth.
- Capture and reuse water from your shower as you wait for the water to get warm.
- Install water-efficient fixtures.
