Hello MMWD Directors.

I am a MMWD ratepayer, native Marinite, and resident since 1952. I urge you to move forward with a permanent water pipeline on the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge and accelerate the process so it is completed by no later than Summer 2022. Do not underestimate the current COVID-related supply chain problems affecting nearly all building materials. Please get pipe ordered ASAP and do the water deals. Get the Governor to help pay for it.

The September 14 article in the IJ "Marin Faces Tight Timeline for Span Water Pipeline" helped illustrate the problem. We have a ticking time bomb in Marin that has or will affect every one of us. It should be obvious the pipeline is a good solution and should be permanent insurance. Droughts happen! The kicker in the article was when the author wrote, "An option the district has is to wait until January, after the start of the rainy season, to decide whether to begin buying construction materials." Is it true that three-month delay to a September completion will require a ban on outdoor watering PLUS severe rationing, a 75% reduction in water use? You would be further degrading our quality of life and property values if you wait.

Doubling down on rationing cannot be the "new normal." We do not want to be slaves to water. You should also take advantage of the dry lakebeds to dig them deeper now, look at raising dams and creating new lakes, and plan for a big desalination plant in case rain and snow in the state is not enough. The ocean is the only unlimited supply of water.

Open Letter Marin Municipal Water District Board of Directors Via email 9-17-21

Soon, the MMWD Board must decide on spending funds to design and build a pipeline and pumping station for additional water supplies.

In this case, time is your enemy. We believe that today is the time to start to rebuild your districts water reserves. In 2022, MMWD will be competing for water for South Bay cities, central valley agricultural operations, large data centers, silicon chip manufacturers, other neighboring states, and fish and wildlife devastation.

Marin Water needs non-interruptible water supplies that cannot be reapportioned by state government, cease to be available due to drought or sold to deeper pocket entities.

Water Train can provide short term water as low a 3¢ a gallon, F.O.B. loading point. Water delivered with minimal infrastructure systems costing MMWD less than \$ 300,000 in most cases. Avoiding millions of dollars for permits, design, engineering, materials, and installation of a trans bay conveyance system with an unsure life expectancy from declining water supplies, or future needlessness.

Water Train is a solid, drought proof secondary water supply alternative where MMWD funds are spent on water, not hardware.
