Please continue to build the pipeline across the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge. Another drought is inevitable, and without that pipeline the district does not have a reliable alternate source of water. The Sonoma dams and the Russian River have the same drought profile our reservoirs do.

In terms of purchasing water, now that we have normal reservoir levels, perhaps you should purchase half the water from Yuba as previously discussed, and/or delay delivery until September and October.
