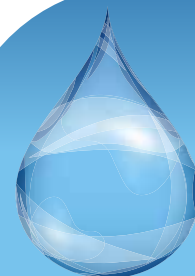


WATER SUPPLY ROADMAP FOR MARIN WATER

Marin Water spent much of 2022 evaluating the District's water needs and has developed a range of water supply alternatives designed to improve the District's water supply resiliency.

The Strategic Water Supply Assessment has benefitted from increased public participation through 18 public meetings and in early 2023, Marin Water anticipates finalizing the roadmap toward water supply resiliency.

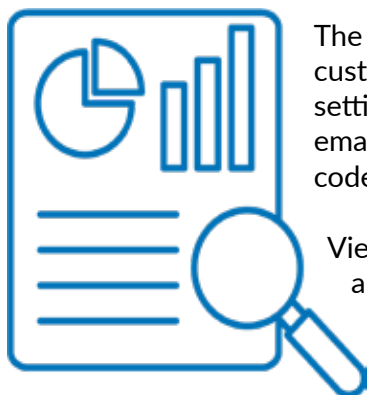

NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS: DISTRICT EXPLORING WATER RATES ADJUSTMENT

This spring, Marin Water will be considering a rate increase to keep up with the rising costs of providing safe and reliable water service. District staff will provide updates at upcoming Board of Directors meetings, written notifications will be sent to customers, the District will host customer information workshops and a public hearing will be conducted. It is anticipated that new rates will take effect in July 2023.

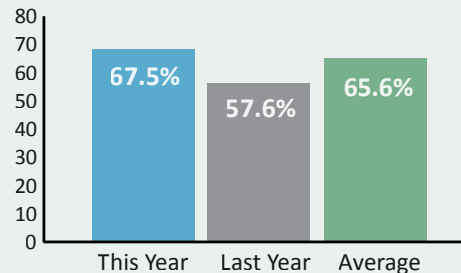


About Our Water Supply

75% of the District's water supply comes from local reservoirs located on Mt. Tamalpais and in west Marin. Here's a look at storage, usage, and rainfall data:

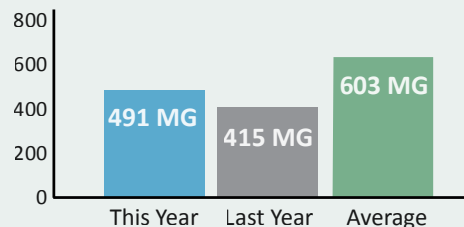
Reservoir Storage

% of total storage capacity as of 12/01/22



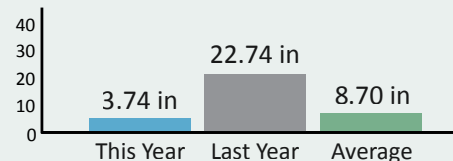
Water Usage
