TRADE YOUR WATER-GUZZLING LAWN FOR SUSTAINABLE, COST-SAVING LANDSCAPING

Outdoor irrigation can be a major drain on local water resources – and on ratepayers' wallets. That problem is compounded when it comes to the watering needs of lawns, which typically use four times as much water as climate-appropriate shrubs and perennials.

That's why Marin Water customers have combined to convert 480,000 square feet of thirsty grass lawns to sustainable landscapes.

Not only do these lawn conversions save customers money, they also pay off in the form of cash rebates that are exempt from state taxes. Marin Water offers \$1.50 to \$3 per square foot of grass replaced to help ease the financial burden of installing new landscaping.

To qualify for the largest rebate, customers are required to follow best management practices as detailed on Marin Water's website, and all customers looking to take advantage of the program are required to seek pre-approval with Marin Water via an online application. NEW WATER RATES TAKING EFFECT

Marin Water adopted a new rate and fee structure in mid-May that will help the District recover from the recent drought and ensure crucial investments in water supply alternatives, aging infrastructure as well as wildfire mitigation efforts on the Mount Tamalpais Watershed - the District's primary source of water supply.

The new rate schedule includes a series of increases that will be implemented during the next four fiscal years, starting July 1, 2023. The changes within the approved rate schedule include three main components:

- An adjustment to the current tiered rate structure to reflect reduced customer demand trends and align cost recovery. The change adjusts volumetric unit rates for all customers and reduces Tier 1 and Tier 2 allotments for duplex and single-family residential customers.
- A modification to Marin Water's fixed fees, which includes converting the Watershed Management Fee to a uniform volumetric rate and incorporating recent customer demand metrics into the fixed fee calculation methodology. This change will help to promote customer water conservation and allow customers greater control over their monthly bills.
- The rate changes include drought surcharges that would go into • effect only during declared water shortages and will ensure Marin Water can recover lost revenue and offset increased costs during future droughts.
